Management report

Basis of operation, membership and governance

The aim of the organisation is to protect the rights, development and interests of children in accordance with the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child and the Child Protection Act of the Republic of Estonia.

The activities of the Sillamäe Child for Chil Association are based on citizens' initiative and act in the public interest. The Sillamäe Society for Child Welfare is the legal successor of the Estonian Large Families Association, founded on 9 December 1989.

Sillamäe Child Welfare Association is a member of the Union for Child Welfare since 1990 and is the only foreign-language speaking organisation to be a member of the Joint Committee of the ECAC (since 2012), a member of the European Anti-Poverty Network (EAPN) (since 2010), a member of the Anna Lindh Foundation Estonia (since 2007) and has consultative status with the United Nations Economic and Social Commission (ECOSOC) (since 2014) and in October 2015. Member of ECOSOC (ECOSOC ECOSOC), member of the European Cultural Network (AMATEO) since March 2018 and full member of the Estonian Youth League (ENL) since October 2018.

General principles of the activities of the Sillamäe Society for Child Welfare.

Sillamäe Society for Child Welfare:

- values every child
- is based on the interests of children and young people

Organisation

Empowering members to carry out advocacy and practical activities at the local level, based on local needs and in cooperation with the local authorities.

Domain

Sillamäe Lastekaitse Ühing monitors developments in the field of children's rights and child protection. Draws attention to violations of children's rights, makes proposals for improving the situation. Proposes and implements new initiatives to support children, young people and families. **Society**

Informing about children's and young people's rights and shaping society's values and attitudes in order to better ensure children's and young people's rights.

The strategic objectives and key actions

The strategic objectives of the Sillamäe Society for Child Welfare and the main activities to achieve them are the following:

- 1. Joining the Union for the Protection of Children and Young People and youth work programmes.
- a. Developing common positions within the organisation through discussions and enhanced communication;
- b. Establishing a functioning system for collecting and analysing information on the situation of children.

2. Raising awareness of children's rights among children and adults.

- a. Training of professionals;
- b. Public awareness-raising;
- c. Publication of information materials and literature.

3. Supporting the multifaceted development of children and young people to enable them to cope successfully in everyday life.

a. Establishing an effective mechanism for eliciting children's views and involving them in planning their own activities;

b. Providing and implementing new initiatives and ideas that contribute to improving parenting practices Promoting cooperation with children's and youth organisations.

4. Developing links and cooperation with other organisations working with children and young people in Estonia and abroad.

a. networking and strengthening cooperation with children's and youth organisations;

b. Joining initiatives and projects of cooperation partners and networks (Peace Child International, EAPN, Anna Lindh Foundation, AMATEO, Asia-Europe Foundation, various networks from the Baltic, Nordic and Mediterranean regions, etc.);

5. Ensuring the continuous development of the organisation

a. Strengthening cooperation at national and international level with partners who have a duty and/or an interest in contributing to a more child-friendly society (cooperation with associations of local authorities, NGOs, the public sector, international partner organisations from the UK, Greece, Spain, Portugal, Germany, Belgium, the Netherlands, Slovakia, Latvia, Lithuania, Denmark, Finland, Sweden, Mediterranean countries (Tunisia and Egypt) and others. Participation in EU cooperation networks) and promoting development cooperation with the European Commission, the Asia-Europe Foundation, the Nordic Council of Ministers, the North-South Centre of the Council of Europe, the Anna Lindh Foundation and UN agencies (UNHCR, UNICEF, etc.);

b. Ensuring continuous multi-level (management, office staff, membership and partners/supporters) development (formulation of the core

values of the organisation, development of a system for assessing the impact of the organisation's activities, development of a staff motivation system, public relations strategy, image development).

The activities of the Sillamäe Children's Welfare Association are linked to and targeted at compliance with the principles of the CSCE and the provisions of its articles. The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) is based on the principle that society, in addition to parents, has a duty to ensure and contribute in every way possible to meeting children's basic needs and to provide support for the development of the child's personality, talents and abilities. By acceding to the Convention, the Republic of Estonia has undertaken to implement these requirements. Collecting information on the situation of children and analysing it makes it possible, on the basis of the problems identified, to propose solutions. The Sillamäe Society for Child Welfare has 248 members.

The management and development of the organisation operates at three levels (strategic management, day-to-day management of the organisation's work and activities, and operational work linked to the achievement of the objectives set by the projects).

In 2021, a total of 4,737 people directly took part in the projects, trainings and events of the Sillamäe Child Welfare Association, in addition to which the Association's main website with its sub-sites www.sscw.ee (unsdg.ee, forum.sscw.ee, media.sscw.ee, inclusiveurope.eu, etc.) had a total of 410,224 unique visitors.
